

## As World Christian doctors meet in Mexico

**Hundreds** of Christian doctors and medical professionals from many countries of the world, including Latin America, will gather in the Del Ray Inn Hotel, Toluca City, Mexico, today and tomorrow, for the 10th Annual World Christian Doctors Network (WCDN) Conference, where they will discuss "Spirituality in Medicine."



According to Dan Wooding, Founder, ASSIST News Service, each of the Christian medical experts believes that "spiritual healing" is an answer to sickness in the 21st Century. According to them, medicine alone cannot deal with some of today's worst illnesses. This is as they also believe that miracles should be documented. During the meeting, various respected doctors will present actual case studies of miracles with the medical evidence, to their audience.

A highlight promises to be when Dr. Chauncey W. Crandall IV, a renowned heart doctor who serves at the Palm Beach Cardiovascular Clinic in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, will make a dramatic presentation about how, after he had prayed for a patient who had died and was being prepared for the morgue, was brought back to life after prayer.

There will be many other presentations including one by Dr. Gilbert Chae (Korea), the president of WCDN, who will talk about "The healing case of Cerebral Hemorrhage," and a case study by Dr. David Eu (Singapore) on the topic of "Sepsis due to Urinary Tract Infection complicated with paralytic ileus and Jaundice."

After they have had made their "miracle" presentations, they will be quizzed by their peers about aspects of the "evidence" and then would share their views about the veracity of a case being a miracle.

The doctors, for these two days, will also forsake the formality of being medics and became "ordinary Christians" and join whole-heartedly in the worship sessions, raising their hands in the air in praise and some even dancing along to the music.

One doctor at last year's conference in Nairobi, Kenya, said; "This has been like a refreshing rain for me. Meeting with doctors who believe in divine healing from around the world, has been such a blessing. There have been times when I thought I was the only doctor who believed in miracles, but now I know that I am not alone, and there are many more who also believe this way."

Dr. Daniel Fuentes Acosta, Chairman of this year's organising committee, and a leader of WCDN Mexico, will be also be making a presentation, with the topic of "Primary sterility because of a chronic anovulation and polycystic ovary syndrome."

He said, "Although medicine should be more humane, compassionate and spiritual, in the XXI century this vocation is lost, which affects the performance and attention to the patient."

"However, there are regions in the world where miracles are commonplace, and Jesus taught us that came to the sick and needy (Matthew 14:14 and Mark 2:17) and that we would do greater things than He (John 14:12)."

In this regard, Dr. Acosta cited Jeremiah 33:6 which declares: "Behold, I will bring to it health and healing, and I will heal them; and I will reveal to them an abundance of peace and truth" (The New American Standard Bible).

He went on to say, "That is, health and sanitation are two very important terms that relate the welfare of the body, soul and spirit. We can have health care, but health or have health, but healing. God wants the human being is full of everything, why Jesus died on the cross to take captive all our sins, sickness and disease (Matt. 8:17).

"In the book of Job is an account important physical health of human beings, and that is when human health is affected, modifies its surroundings, what man would not give his own life?"

Dr. Acosta is also a leader of Alianza Medica Cristiana Mexico (AMEC) – Christian Medical Alliance Mexico State – which was formed, he said, "in response to the need for a Christian medical society to share the knowledge of God and health through medical care based on biblical principles show the power of God and the gifts He has given us."

He added, "As its name implies, AMEC is a civil society composed of personnel working in the area of health and sharing the Christian faith. We are a Christian interdenominational alliance Mexico State, composed entirely of Christian physicians committed to providing medical care based on love, compassion, humanity, respect.

"Our mission involves attention to both the Christian population of the Valley of Toluca and to the general public, all through a medical network. We also encourage altruism in underserved communities or serious deficiencies in order to exalt the name of God through the gifts God has placed in our hands.

"For over 20 years, and even medical students had this dream and vision of God in our hearts, but it was not until July 2011 when he realised. Our first meeting was attended by 15 members. The second went over 25 and even attended some pastors of the city of Toluca."

He said that this is the first time, one of these unique conferences is being held in Latin American and there will be attendees from different countries in the region such as Argentina, Brazil, Costa Rica, Puerto Rico, El Salvador, Colombia, Guatemala, Venezuela, Peru, "and of course, from our beloved Mexico, with doctors from different cities around Mexico also attending this wonderful event."

Dr. Acosta said, "This conference has created great expectation among Christian medical doctors from all over Latin America and with pastors associations who also will attend.

"Our Mexican government is very interested in promoting this kind of event in our country. Also some other Christian medical associations from Latin America will attend the 10th WCDN Conference.

"We are very happy and blessed for this opportunity to share the amazing love and mercy our Lord Jesus Christ."

The entire conference will have live streaming on the internet, and will have simultaneous translation into various languages for those watching it.

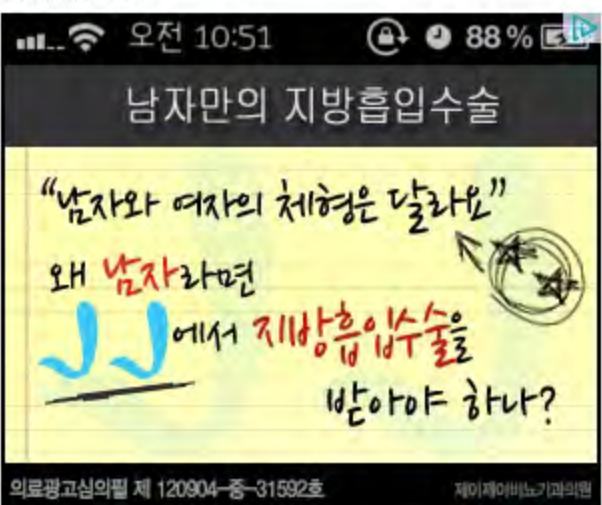
